# Get Down to Earth! Gardening Plots for Parents and Children

Memorial Day (May 31) - Labor Day (September 6)

This year, we are offering a limited number of garden plots and a special opportunity for parents to introduce their children to the wonders of gardening! Your 3' x 6' plot will be within our fenced-in vegetable garden.

What our farmers are offering you:

- · Richly fertilized and roto-tilled soil
- Access to fresh water
- · A team of encouraging volunteer advisors, if you need help

What our farmers are asking of you:

- A current updated Family membership (or higher) to the Education Center
- To consider planting seeds from this recommended list: radishes, beets, lettuce, carrots, or basil (please no vining plants the plot size is to small)
- An agreement to weed and water at least 3-times a week (a daily basis is preferred)
- Your commitment will run from Memorial Day to Labor Day, after which time the gardens will be "put to bed"
- By becoming a part of this cooperative gardening community, you will meet fellow enthusiasts and be required to work together to meet your responsibilities

#### Summer Time Fun On At New Pond!

Six one-week-long opportunities are available to children ages 6-8 and 9-12

Monday - Friday, 9:30 AM - 12 PM June 21 - 25, June 28 - July 2, July 12 - 16, July 26 - 30, August 2 - 6, and August 9 - 13

Our 102-acre outdoor classroom, with its woodlands, wetlands, meadows, pastures, and barnyard, will be ours to explore! Every morning will be filled to the brim with hands-on outdoor adventures based on the theme of the day. Search the stream for crayfish, explore the pond for tadpoles, get up close and personal with our turtles, frogs and other program animals, build survival shelters, learn about woodland Indians, visit with our farm animals, plant and harvest in the gardens, do some nature crafting, play fun conservation games, and so much more. This summer program includes two opportunities to swim in our crystal-clear pool, under the supervision of a lifeguard. Young explorers will leave us as nature detectives and nature defenders!

All programs are designed to be held outside (rain or shine), however in the event of extreme weather we will move inside to large well-ventilated spaces that allow for social distancing.

Each week is \$275 per member, \$325 per non-member (includes daily snacks, a t-shirt, & two swims)



# **OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES PROGRAM FOR FAMILIES & FRIEND GROUPS**

Spring is the perfect season to get outside and we have several flexible options for you! In response to the impact of COVID-19 on the area schools, your unexpectedly fluid schedules, and keeping everyone's safety in mind, we are offering the following menu of hands-on outdoor activities for your immediate family or your friend group

# OPTION #1: Arrange a Program for Families & Friend Groups

With at least one adult - Great for homeschool groups and children of any age with a parent! Up to 12 participants, 90-minute program \$90 per member group and \$100 per non-member group

#### OPTION #2: Arrange a Drop-Off Program for 6 Friends

Ages 6-10\* Up to 8 participants, 90-minute program \$90 per member group and \$100 per non-member group

#### **How It Works**

#### Choose a time slot that fits your schedule during April - August.

- · Time blocks will be reserved on a first come, first served basis
- All participants will be required to wear a face mask and practice social distancing
- Please dress for the weather, programs will be held outside whenever possible. If moved inside, participants will be appropriately distanced in our Learning Center.
- A parent/guardian will be asked to sign our Release Form on the day of each program (1 per family) \*We will need a form from each Friend/Family
- · Pre-registration and payment are required

#### **Woodland Indians**

Visit our longhouse and wigwam. Learn about Woodland Indian: family life, what they wore, how they cooked, what they ate, and games played. Sample traditional foods while sitting in a Woodland Indian kitchen.

#### **Insect Hunt**

Become a member of the Bug Squad! Using nets, bug boxes, and magnifying glasses we will hunt for, examine, and observe a fantastic variety of insects in our pollinator meadow, wetlands, and gardens. Learn about life cycles, food chains, and the important roles insects play in nature and in our lives as pollinators, decomposers, and more! Learn about the Pollinator-Pathway initiative right here in Redding and neighboring towns.

#### Farm Animals

Moo, cluck, baa, oink! Meet our cows, chickens, sheep, and pigs and learn about what's on their menu, where they sleep, and their activities on the farm. Then meet our smallest members of our livestock: honey bees! Visit a hive and learn about all the inner dynamics that are taking place amongst the specialized players who live inside!

# **Freshwater Exploration**

From crayfish to salamanders and turtles to tadpoles, let's discover who actually lives in our stream, pond, and marsh and try to figure out why they select these different habitats. Learn about the parade of birds, mammals, reptiles, and amphibians that just visit these wetland areas. Help us to do some problem solving-what happens to these creatures during times of high and low water? Please wear clothes and shoes that can get wet!

# Hike/Scavenger Hunt

Two different options exist: the first for younger participants ages 3-6 and the second for ages 7 and up. Younger scavenger hunters will focus on "hunting" along the farm road loop while more advanced hunters will venture up to the trails on the hill. Watch the excitement level increase on either pathway they are on. Please wear comfortable walking shoes.
