#### **Wolves of North America**

A Virtual Presentation Wednesday, March 16, 6:30 PM - 7 PM



Learn about North America's wildest residents - wolves - during an education session with an expert from the Wolf Conservation Center in North Salem NY who will share the history, ecology, and biology of wolves. You will also learn about the current challenges facing wolf recovery across the United States with an emphasis placed on endangered species recovery programs for critically endangered red wolves and Mexican gray wolves.

# **Signs of Seasonal Changes**

March 2

Bundle up and take a discovery walk. Look for clues about animal activity during this cold month. Footprints help us see what animals are active

### Signs of Spring

April 6

On this walk we will be looking for signs of spring- emerging plants, birds carrying nesting materials, bees gathering pollen, and activity in our wetlands.



### **Wetland Exploration**

May 4

Now that the weather is warmer, we can put on our boots and wade into the stream to look for active animals like water pennies and crayfish. Then we will venture over to the marsh in search of tadpoles and dragonfly nymphs!

Our 102-acre outdoor classroom, with its woodlands, wetlands, meadows, pastures, and barnyard will be ours to explore! Every day will be filled to the brim with hands-on outdoor adventures based on the theme of that day. Activities may include: searching the stream for crayfish, exploring the pond for tadpoles, getting up close and personal with our program animals, building survival shelters, learning about Woodland Indians, visiting our farm animals, planting seeds in our garden, doing some nature crafts, playing conservation games, taking a hike, and much, more!

This program allows for several swims in our pool each week under the supervision of a certified lifeguard.

All programs are designed to be held outside (rain or shine), however in the event of extreme weather we will move inside to a large well-ventilated space that allows for social distancing.
