Free entry, there will be small fees for food and craft tickets. No registration required. Please, no dogs.

Join us for an exciting afternoon on the farm amidst the beautiful fall foliage. This fantastic family event will include historical demonstrations such as broom making, blacksmithing, and make and break engines. There will be livestock encounters-sheep shearing, cow judging, visits with our calves, and closeup views of our honeybees' fascinating activities while in their observation hive. Try your hand at harvest crafts: create grapevine wreaths, decorate pumpkins, roll beeswax candles - and so much more! Science and Nature Fun: gaze through solar-filtered telescopes, learn how our weather station operates, and visit our native American encampment.


## The Voice of the Hudson Movie & Discussion November 6, 7:00 PM - 8:30 PM Co-sponsored by the Mark Twain Library

Microplastics are ubiquitous in the environment and can be found in marine and freshwater ecosystems, food, air, and drinking water. Learn more about this important issue with consultant, educator, researcher, and explorer Tim Keyes as he shares the results of sampling done around the country, including here at New Pond Farm. Following the discussion, watch *The Voice of the Hudson*, a 50 minute documentary film about the monumental trip 8 high schoolers took down the length of the Hudson in 2023, from the Adirondacks to Manhattan, taking water samples along the way.




## Garden in Art: A Bouquet of Stories




## Stargazing Friday, October 4, 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM
